The **Theatre Royal, Drury Lane** was first set up in about 1663 when Charles II allowed theatres to open again after the Cromwellian Period. It is the oldest continuously used theatre on its original site in London. It has recently been restored to its Regency splendour. Backstage and the stage are very modern with all the latest facilities. George III and the Prince Regent both loved the theatre but were not on speaking terms so the theatre has the King's side and the Prince's side with their boxes. (They never went there on the same occasion!) The current show is "Charlie and The Chocolate Factory" with its cast of children as well as adult actors.

We will start with instant coffee and Mark Fox, their advertising manager, will talk to us and take us on a tour of the auditorium, stage and backstage.

After lunch, Martin Olutniks will take us around Covent Garden telling us of the history from the time it was the garden of a convent, through its time as a vegetable and fruit market to the present tourist attraction.
